# **College** Visits

# STEAM – Argonne National Labs

To further scholar interests in STEAM, the Madonna Foundation once again teamed up with our program partner, Argonne National Labs. A panel of women scientists at Argonne discussed careers in cyber security, bio-medical engineering and other new and emerging careers in science and technology. # FASFA/Financial Aid

# **Career Day**

We were so pleased to bring back an in-person Career Day this year. This year's focus was Women in Business. In February, our students met with professionals from the fields of accounting, human resources, finance, IT and law to gain an understanding of potential career paths. The common message of these highly accomplished professionals urged our scholars to follow their passion and rise above limitations imposed by society to achieve their goals. Our scholars were encouraged and heartened to hear the stories of these successful women who worked hard and overcame obstacles to reach the pinnacle of their careers! # ACT

The juniors took part in a virtual ACT prep course with the Princeton Review. They provided the Madonna scholars with ACT test preparation and individualized study throughout the year. Access to year-long prep class materials and online instruction helped them increase their ACT scores, opening more doors to college acceptances.

# Wintrust Smart Money Workshop

Smart Money, a financial literacy workshop for scholars and their parents conducted by Wintrust Bank, was held in January. During the two interactive virtual sessions, participants learned the basics of spending, saving and creating personal and household budgets. Wintrust presenters gave helpful advice on how to best navigate difficult economic times and avoid falling into financial ruin or a mountain of debt. 
